GENERAL OVERVIEW

The **ONE Basketball Challenge “OBC”** is a basketball shootout tournament for individual basketball players wishing to win prizes based on their shooting abilities. OBC is a program that is operated by the **ONE Basketball Organization “OBO”**.

The OBC measures an individual basketball player’s shooting abilities which is measured in principal by allowing players to attempt and rebound their own shot without the help of any other player or apparatus.

There will be two Challenges for individual players to win prizes:

1. **Timed Skill Challenge**
2. **Bracket Challenge**

Cash payouts will be in the form of a VISA Gift Card. Winners may opt to receive their Prize in-hand (OR) mailed to them. Payouts are as follows:

Timed Challenge

IMPORTANT: the top 64 players with the best individual times will advance into the Bracket Tournament

RULES

A Simple Rule System:

When attempting a basket, players must retrieve their own rebound without the help or assistance of another player or apparatus. This method will continue until the mark has been reached of **(10 made 3-point baskets)**.

The goal of both the Timed Skill Challenge AND the Bracket Shootout is to make (10 3-point baskets) in the shortest amount of time.

The **TOP 3** best times per category of the Timed Skill Challenge will win their cash prize. The **TOP 64** best times per category will advance to the Bracket Shootout.

Players can attempt to set their best time as many times as they would like during the allotted time span of 9am – 2pm.

Three (3) players will shoot on each half court at a time – each utilizing their own ball. Players are not allowed to interfere, bump, or prevent another player from attempting a shot.

Referees may deduct one (1) made basket during play from a player who purposefully interferes with another player.

The timer will begin when the referee indicates to begin. The timer will end once the first player on the court has made (10) 3-point baskets.

Once the first player out of the three has made (10) made baskets, the timer will stop and be recorded onto the leaderboard. All three players may get back in line to shoot again.

Note:

If a ball gets stuck or is not retrievable, it is at the discretion of the referee to either stop play or allow play to continue.

Any interference from outside Participants or spectators who are not actively involved in the current Challenge may result in a made basket being deducted or in some cases forfeiture of the player from that attempt.

SCHEDULE

Doors will open promptly at 9am and the Timed Skill Challenge will end promptly at 2pm. The Bracket Challenge will run approximately from 2pm until 3pm.

Note: If you intend to begin playing at 9am, please arrive between 8am – 8:30am. We expect a small line to form outside the facility and our staff will help with the check-in process while you are in line. You will receive a “PLAYER IDENTIFICATION NUMBER” which you will use throughout the Tournament.

PARTICIPANTS AND ELIGIBILITY

The OBC is open to anyone ages 6 years old and above. Due to their being no physical contact - boys, girls, and some adaptive athletes will compete together on the same court.

Players may register on the OBC website for a fee of \$20 (OR) at the door for \$30 (credit card processing available). Online registration will end on August 24th at 9pm PST.

Each Participant will be responsible for his/her own apparel, shoes, and meals along with all of their personal belongings. Participants are allowed to bring their own basketballs in the case where they may have a 'better feel' for his/her ball.

OBO reserves the right to alter, amend, or change the OBC Program.

OBO reserves the right to disqualify any Participant at any point during the Tournament for any reason if OBO believes that the participation of a Participant is or may become harmful to or interfere with the integrity, competition, or production of the Tournament, including without limitation to enforce the rules of the Tournament, promote the entertainment value of the event and to maintain the reputation of the Tournament and avoid any impropriety or even the appearance of impropriety.

If a Participant is disqualified from the Tournament, is not present for any game in which it is scheduled to play, or if a Participant determines that they are unable to compete in the Tournament, then that Participant shall forfeit all paid fees. If a Participant is disqualified from the Tournament during play, all results from their previous attempts stand and cannot be challenged or changed; however, that Participant shall forfeit all paid fees.

At the conclusion of the Tournament, the winning Participants agree to participate in interviews, photographs and other media related requests for a period of one week. These interviews and other media requests can be conducted electronically. Each participant further acknowledges that they have been provided with a reasonable period of time to review the foregoing rules, and to ask OBO any and all questions that the participant may have with respect to the rules, the tournament, the prizes and any other questions it may have, and by registering on the website each participant agrees to all of the foregoing rules.
